- 2. Program Commentary (list critical issues, problems, and successes/completed projects of the past month): State historical marker for R.C. Hickman was dedicated at the site of a former community gathering place, kicking off the every-two-year reunion of the former black school - McFarland in a program arranged by the Landmark Commission. The Main Street Board was still striving to again reserve Amtrak cars for next year's Wine Train. It was also ordering supplies and contacting contractors for repair of the gazebo with concrete replacement of grassy areas on each side of the gazebo beginning at the very end of the month. The board had chosen this option due to the grassy areas being difficult to keep maintained and therefore detracting from the appearance of the area. Main Street Manager attended CLG regional training with National Alliance of Preservation Commission representatives in Tyler. Main Street manager spoke on local radio station KMOO about program and city events.
