CALL TO ORDER Mayor Lankford called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and confirmed a quorum of the council was present.

DISCUSSION ON ACTION ITEMS, PUBLIC HEARINGS, PRESENTATIONS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

7. Discuss and consider action to close the Nature Preserve for the annual Texas Youth Hunting Program Dept with Texas Parks and Wildlife Youth Hunt on January 14, 15 & 16.

Councilmember Eric Carrington made the motion to close the Preserve for the youth hunt. Councilmember Sue Jones seconded the motion and it carried by a unanimous vote.

8. Discuss and consider action on an ordinance establishing regulations concerning ground transportation and/or taxi service within the city of Mineola.

Councilmember Newman made the motion to postpone the ordinance to the next city council meeting. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Eric Carrington and carried by a unanimous vote.

9. Discuss and consider action on an ordinance approving the redistricting of the city's wards and establishing new ward boundary lines based on 2020 Census data.

Councilmember Newman made the motion to adopt the ordinance to redistrict Mineola city wards, approving "Plan A" of the two plans presented to council. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Tuck and carried by a unanimous vote.

10. Discuss and consider action on bid acceptance for construction of a **280** ft. guyed communications tower.

David Madsen informed the council that two bids were received. After thorough review, he recommended awarding the bid to Inter-County Communications. Councilmember Sampson made the motion to award the bid to Inter-County Communications for construction of the tower. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Newman and carried by a unanimous vote.

11. Discuss and consider action on 2022 Meredith Requests.

City Secretary Cindy Karch presented the Meredith Requests as presented by city staff with projects scored by council in order of importance. Councilmember Eaton made the motion to approve the request. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Carrington and carried by a unanimous vote.

12. City Manager Briefing and Announcements

In the absence of the City Manager, City Secretary Cindy Karch briefed the council of City Manager Mercy Rushing completing her required training on the financial investment act; the yearend sales tax revenue ending on a plus; the Mineola Historical Preservation group dissolving and donated the remaining funds to the Landmark Commission; and the E-150 Mountain Biking event on January 9th, 2022.
