## Survey Focus: Residents

We conducted the budget priorities survey to gather input primarily from Mineola residents who are eligible to vote in city elections. This focus is crucial for several reasons:



#### Direct Representation:

Residents who vote in city elections directly influence local government decisions through their electoral participation. Their feedback ensures that budget priorities reflect the needs and preferences of those who have a say in electing city officials.



Community Impact: The residents of Mineola are directly affected by the day-to-day services and infrastructure funded by the city budget. From public safety to street maintenance and recreational facilities, these services significantly impact their quality of life.



#### Civic Engagement:

Encouraging voter participation in budget discussions strengthens civic engagement and empowers residents to play an active role in shaping the future of their community.

## Detailed Theme Summaries

#### Street Improvements:

Citizens consistently emphasize the need for improved street maintenance and upgrades. This includes repairing potholes, resurfacing roads, and enhancing traffic control systems to ensure safer and more efficient travel throughout the city.

Support for Public Safety: There is a strong call for maintaining and enhancing public safety services. This includes better funding and resources for police, fire, and EMS departments to ensure they can effectively protect and serve the community. Updating and expanding facilities for these services is also a priority.

#### Economic Development:

Promoting economic growth through support for local businesses and tourism is a major concern. Citizens suggest providing incentives for small businesses. enhancing tourism marketing efforts, and organizing events that involve local enterprises to stimulate the local economy.

#### Code Enforcement & Beautification:

Effective code enforcement is seen as crucial for maintaining property standards and the overall appearance of the city. Citizens advocate for stricter regulations and more proactive measures to ensure properties are well-maintained, contributing to a more attractive and livable community.

# Growth: There is a clear focus on preparing the city for future growth. This includes strategic planning, upgrading infrastructure, and ensuring city services can accommodate an increasing population. Competitive wages for city employees are also highlighted as necessary to retain

skilled workers.

Preparing for Future

Senior & Community Services: Providing better services and facilities for senior citizens and the wider community is a recurring theme. Citizens suggest the creation of a dedicated Senior Center, more community events, and enhanced recreational opportunities to improve the quality of life for all residents.

## Summary of Citizen Comments

Preparing for Future	Focus on retaining employees by offering competitive wages.
Growth	Update and expand the police department and city hall buildings.
Street Improvements	Emphasize the need for better street maintenance and improvements.
Support for Small	Encourage local business involvement in city events.
Businesses and Tourism	Promote small businesses and tourism to boost the local economy.
Utilize Local Businesses	Preference for using local businesses over outsiders for city events and services.
Fiscal Conservatism	Advocate for responsible budgeting and professional police department staff.
Senior Citizen Support	Avoid increasing property taxes, which can burden seniors on fixed incomes.
Serior Citizen Support	More facilities and activities for seniors, such as a dedicated Senior Center.
Better Amenities	Desire for more and better restaurants and an expanded farmers market.
Youth Engagement	Suggest creating a youth center and utilizing existing facilities for this purpose.
Neighborhood Regulations	Implement regulations and covenants for specific subdivisions to maintain property standards.

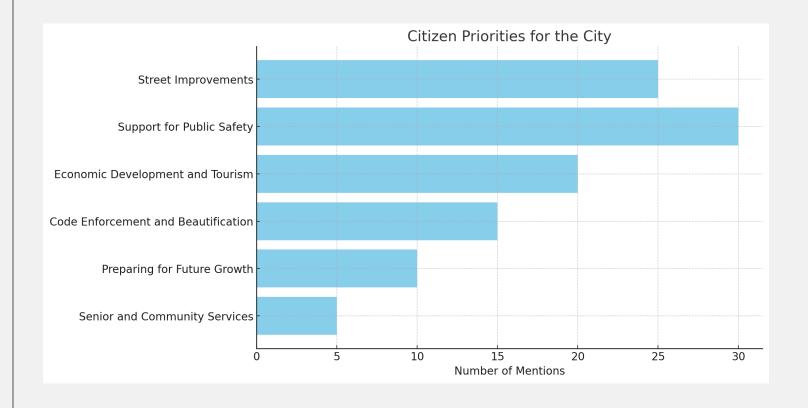

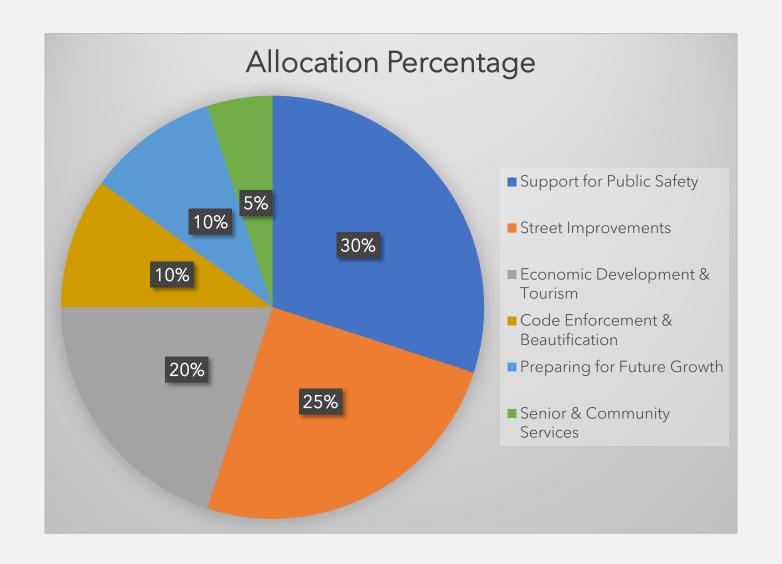

Code Enforcement and Beautification ensure the city remains attractive and well-maintained.

Preparing for Future
Growth addresses the need to plan and manage the city's expansion effectively.

Senior and Community Services ensure that the needs of all residents, particularly seniors, are met.

## Suggested Metrics

#### Street Improvements

- Metric: Number of miles of roads repaired or resurfaced
  - Target: Increase by X miles/year
- Metric: Number of potholes filled
  - Target: Fill X potholes/month
- Metric: Average citizen satisfaction rating with street conditions
  - Target: Achieve an average rating of Y or higher on surveys

#### Support for Public Safety

- Metric: Response times for police, fire, and EMS

- Metric: Number of new equipment purchases or upgrades
  - Target: Acquire X new vehicles/equipment/year
- Metric: Training hours completed by public safety personnel

#### Code Enforcement and Beautification

- Metric: Number of code violations resolved
  - Target: Resolve X violations/month
- Metric: Number of community clean-up events held
  - Target: Host X events/year
- Metric: Participation rate in beautification programs
  - Target: Increase participation by X%/year
- Metric: Citizen satisfaction with neighborhood appearance
  - Target: Achieve an average satisfaction rating of Y or higher

## Suggested Metrics (cont.)

#### Preparing for Future Growth

- Metric: Number of infrastructure projects completed
  - Target: Complete X projects/year
- Metric: Employee retention rate
  - Target: Achieve an employee retention rate of X%
- Metric: Population growth rate and housing availability
  - Target: Maintain a balanced growth rate and ensure adequate housing availability
- Metric: Citizen satisfaction with city planning
  - Target: Achieve an average satisfaction rating of Y or higher

#### Senior and Community Services

- Metric: Number of new senior programs or services offered
  - Target: Introduce X new programs/year
- Metric: Participation rate in community and senior programs
  - Target: Increase participation by X%/year
- Metric: Citizen satisfaction with senior services
  - Target: Achieve an average satisfaction rating of Y or higher
- Metric: Number of community events held
  - Target: Host X events/year

## Implementation and Tracking

By setting specific, measurable targets and regularly tracking these metrics, the city can demonstrate the effectiveness of the budget allocations in addressing the priorities identified by the citizens.



Quarterly Reports: Provide quarterly updates to the city council on progress toward these metrics.



Citizen Feedback: Regularly survey citizens to gather feedback on their satisfaction with improvements and services.



Public Dashboards: Create an online dashboard where citizens can track the city's progress on these metrics.



Annual Review: Conduct an annual review to assess performance against targets and adjust strategies as needed.
